SCHOOL PROFILE

Greentree School is a Pre-K to 6 school with a current population of 364 students.

We currently have three full-time kindergarten classes and three grade one classes. Students in grades three through six are divided between two grade-level classrooms, along with two classrooms of split grades. Additionally, our Achieving Independence classroom supports students with diverse academic, social and behviour needs.

Our athletics program, Leadership Teams, and club days further enhance the experience of our students.

COMMENT ON RESULTS

Greentree School's excellent instructional team's commitment to quality education continues to contribute to our students' high achievement in academics. In Language Arts our students consistently reach high achievement levels. This is highlighted in a comparison to our division and provincial results over the last five years (included in this report). In order to enhance this high level of achievement and to foster our students' deep understanding of subject matter, we have planned a purposeful implementation of strategies intended to continually improve results.

STRATEGIES

- Greater emphasis on teachers' professional learning with a focus on cultivating thinking at Greentree School, combining internal and external opportunities appropriate to school and teacher goals.
- Provide time for teachers to collaborate in PLCs with a focus on implementing evidence-based instructional practices.
 - Provided direction for basis of PLCs to build thinking classrooms (book studies)
 - Ensured accountability of PLC work through a set time to share

each group's work (evidence of effectiveness in fireside chats)

- Utilize instructional coaches to provide in-context support that is targeted toward the needs of individual teachers, PLCs, and other teacher groups.
- Participate in division-wide focus groups that are topic specific such as numeracy and literacy (Math Minds, Mathology).
- Support new teachers to participate in mentorship and collaborative professional learning opportunities.
- Increase access to meaningful technology use for students and professional learning for teachers.

FACILITY AND CAPITAL

Over the summer, our bus loop and parking lot were paved. The parking lot was also extended at this time. Windows with UV tint were installed in classrooms in the upper south wing.

At the same time, several areas around the school were reorganized and rearranged in order to increase the potential for use by students and staff.

In the fall of 2019 one specific area was dedicated for a new multi-grade learning space. This exciting new collaborative space will include technology jointly funded through a Rotary Club grant and Greentree School Council. Division resources such as robotics will enrich the space for our students. Additionally, the area will host student Maker Challenges and STEM or STEAM activities with support from division instructional coaches.

This area will develop over the next few months and we anticipate it will be a hub of activity for our school, teachers, parents, and students.
